

Jefferson Collaborative Membership Information

The <u>Jefferson Community Collaborative</u> is a network of community-serving organizations who are committed to working together to improve community life in Pittsburgh's South Hills and lower Mon Valley. As a direct outcome of the inaugural Jefferson Forum in 2015, the Collaborative emerged as a platform for organizations across the Jefferson Region to network and collaborate. The Collaborative has become a membership of 100+ community-based organizations and an incubator for powerful ideas, a tool for capacity building and a facilitator of group action on broad community aspirations.

- **Our Mission**: To bring together change-makers to positively impact the health & vitality of communities south of Pittsburgh.
- **Our Vision**: To create agile, healthy, and sustainable communities for diverse populations throughout the Jefferson region.

The Collaborative comes together in full meetings throughout the year and sponsors <u>initiatives</u> including the Jefferson Counts 2020 Census Campaign, Mental Health First Aid and the Around the Table South community conversation project. In addition to these networking opportunities, issue-oriented **Action Teams** enable member organizations to work together on cross-sector solutions for key challenges in our communities. Our current focus areas are *Diversity, Equity and Racial Justice* and *Civic and Policy Engagement*:

Diversity, Equity, and Racial Justice Action Team

This Team has conducted Implicit Bias Training, Racial Wealth Gap Simulations, and produced a <u>DEI Resource Bank</u> to embody the following principles:

- 1. Celebrating differences
- 2. Striving for equity and inclusion in the Jefferson Area
- 3. Championing racial justice

Civic and Policy Engagement Action Team

This Team has developed a civic and policy engagement plan with the following goals:

- 1. Education and training of Collaborative members on how to best approach civic and policy engagement
- 2. Education of elected officials and regulators of the value of the work of members of the Collaborative
- 3. Providing a collective voice for issues through the Collaborative

- 4. **Following the Jefferson Community Collaborative Code of Conduct.** The Jefferson Community Collaborative asks participating organizations to adhere to the following Code of Conduct to maintain, open, respectful, and productive meetings and teams.
 - 1. Participants will maintain a welcoming & inclusive environment
 - 2. Participants will engage in meetings by expressing their own point of view in a respectful, appropriate manner
 - 3. Participants will consider others' points of view in a thoughtful, considerate matter and respond constructively
 - 4. Participants will be representatives for and voices of the people they serve. Resident/community voice is vital for moving the Collaborative and the Jefferson region forward
 - 5. Participants will represent the Collaborative to community members and additional stakeholders
