INTRODUCTION

What is the Jefferson Votes Initiative?

The objective of the Jefferson Votes initiative is to inspire Jefferson area residents to participate in the election process, leveraging local organizations as trusted community resources to:

- 1. Strengthen Collaborative organizations in the Jefferson community to increase voter registration and participation.
- 2. The Jefferson community is confident, comfortable, and informed about the process of voting.
- 3. Regional interest and enthusiasm in civic engagement rises and continues.

Who are Voter Engagement Champions?

Nonprofit organizations serve as trusted resources for community members to strengthen their voice through voter engagement. The Jefferson Collaborative is excited to provide targeted, nonpartisan resources and training around voter engagement as part of the Jefferson Votes initiative. Voter Engagement Champions are key partners within the Jefferson Votes initiative. These organizations have agreed to participate in nonpartisan voter engagement efforts through a multitude of activities including voter engagement trainings, material distribution, communications, and event hosting. What is the purpose of this toolkit?

The <u>Jefferson Votes</u> Toolkit is one piece of the nonpartisan initiative created by the Jefferson Regional Foundation and the 100+ member strong Jefferson Community Collaborative. The Jefferson Collaborative is excited to provide targeted, nonpartisan resources and training for nonprofit organizations in the Jefferson area. Within this Toolkit, you will find ready-to-use materials specifically created for the Jefferson Votes initiative to help organizations with voter engagement efforts. Included are also from voter engagement resources from Nonprofit VOTE, National Voter Registration Day and the Pennsylvania Department of State.

Jefferson Regional Foundation

Jefferson Regional Foundation has provided nearly \$20 million in grant awards to around 120 different community organizations in the area since it was funded in March 2013 as part of the affiliation agreement for Jefferson Hospital to become part of the Allegheny Health Network. The Foundation is dedicated to grantmaking in the South Hills and Mon Valley areas of Pittsburgh to address the social determinants of health. It operates three major grant cycles a year and also distributes minigrants, all of which focus on the following priorities:

- Health and Wellness
- Diversity, Equity and Inclusion
- Workforce and Economic Opportunity
- Civic Engagement and Policy Work
- Early Childhood and Youth Development
- Capacity Building

The Foundation also hosts an annual conference called the Jefferson Forum, staffs the 100+ member Jefferson Community Collaborative and a series of community conversations called Around the Table South. The Jefferson Community Collaborative

Hosted and staffed by the Jefferson Regional Foundation, the Jefferson Community Collaborative a network of communityserving organizations who are committed to working together to improve community life in Pittsburgh's South Hills and lower Mon Valley. The Collaborative has become a membership of 100+ community-based organizations and an incubator for powerful ideas, a tool for capacity building, and a facilitator of group action on broad community aspirations. In addition to holding five member meetings each year, the Jefferson Community Collaborative hosts monthly action teams, and houses an online resource guide called the Jefferson Community Directory.

- Vision: To create agile, healthy, and sustainable communities for diverse populations throughout the Jefferson region.

Election FAQs



Who can vote in PA?

- 1) Individuals who have been citizens for at least 1 month
- 2) Individuals 18 years or older who have been a resident of PA and the district at least 30 days prior to the election
- 3) Some individuals with a criminal status or history may qualify to vote. Refer to vote.pa.gov for more information on these criteria.
- Register to vote! Voter registration takes 5 minutes and can be done online at <u>vote.pa.gov</u>, in person at the Allegheny County election offices or through the mail.
- Know your candidate. Visit the candidate's website for their political positions. Campaign <u>finance information</u> and <u>past voting records</u> are available to the public are available to the public.
- Voting is secure and easy. There are several safeguards to making voting accessible and secure: new voting systems, post-election audits, layered set of protections, strategic data sharing, collaboration and communication, ongoing training.

November 8, 2022 is the General Election

- Polls are open **7 A.M. 8 P.M**, and if you are in line at **8 P.M**. you can vote
- Last day to register to vote: October 24, 2022
- Last day to request a mail-in or absentee ballot: **November 1, 2022**

Jefferson Votes: Voter Engagement Resources

There are many ways that you and your organization can participate in voter engagement within your community. Incorporate voter education in your organization's programming, events, and communications. Be sure to keep voter resources on-site at your organization. Below are Jefferson Votes resources that have been developed to use in conjunction with your voter engagement efforts. 1. Share valuable voting tips with the Jefferson Votes Election Guide: The Election Guide is perfect to share as a handout at your organization or during a specific event or program. The guide can also easily attach to an email or other communications around voting. It is a great resource for information around polling locations, researching candidates, and the role of elected officials. 2. Voter Pledge Cards work as effective reminders! Voter pledge cards are an effective way to remind voters in your community to vote and increase voter turnout on election day. Constituents take physical copies of the Voter Pledge card to place on their mirror or refrigerator – anywhere that they look often to remind them to vote and the reasons that voting is important. This is a great resource to have available at a desk or share during in person events or programming. This pledge card is available to download at https://jeffersoncollaborative.org/our-resources/jefferson-votes/voter-engagement-toolkit/.



3. Communicate the importance of voting with Jefferson Votes Posters: Putting up physical posters is a great way to remind individuals to vote. This simple act serves as a reminder for individuals to vote and serves as an indicator that your organization values voting as a civic duty. A community that votes is a healthy community. Print and hang these posters up on-site or provide copies for your constituents to take and use for their own purposes. Like the Election Guide and Voter Pledge, this is a great resource to share during in person events or programming for your organization. Keep these materials onsite at your organizations or as an add-in to your daily programming or special events. These posters can also be shared on your social media and website. 4. **Promote the value your organization places on voting with sample emails to staff and constituents:** As trusted community resources, sharing information about registering to vote and voting with your staff, volunteers, and constituents relays the importance your organization places on this civic duty.
